UPDATE ON COVID-19 VACCINATIONS

From Cheverly Mayor Laila Riazi:

Residents who need help registering for the vaccine can now access a new vaccine registration hotline by calling 311 and pressing #. This line is meant specifically for those who have trouble accessing the Internet and utilizing technology, and need assistance with the vaccine pre-registration process.

- EVERYONE ELSE should pre-register at https://bit.ly/PGCVaccineForm
- Vaccines will only be available for residents or for people who work in Prince George's County!
- You will be contacted by phone or email.
- Private links will be sent to individuals when vaccine is available.
- Private links will be sent for individual second doses* for the advised date.
- Bring proof of residency/employment to your appointment.
 *Vaccine is being reserved for second dosage.
